This is an Easy Read version of some information. It may not include all of the information but it will tell you about the important parts.




This Easy Read booklet uses easier words and pictures. Some people may still want help to read it.

Blue and underlined words show links to websites and email addresses. You can click on these links on a computer.


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About this booklet



This booklet is from Transport for All.



Many places in the UK are improving the **transport** services in their local areas.

Transport is how people travel around. It includes cars, buses, trains and trams.



We are running some **workshops** to find out how disabled people can be included in improving transport.

A **workshop** is a group meeting where people talk about or work on something together.



This booklet will explain what the workshops are about, and how you can take part in them.

About the workshops



The workshops will include:

• Disabled people who live or regularly travel in Edinburgh.



 People who make important decisions in Edinburgh, like people who work in councils.



At the workshops, we will talk about:

 How transport can be better for disabled people.



• How disabled people can be included in improving transport.

The workshops



You can take part in a workshop if you:


• Are disabled.



• Live in Edinburgh.



• Do not live in Edinburgh but often travel there, like for work.



You can take part in either the in person workshops or the online workshops.

In person workshops




The in person workshops will take 2 whole days.



The first day will be on Wednesday 2 October 2024.



The second day will be on Wednesday 19 February 2025.



On both days the workshop will:

• Start at 10:00am and finish at 4:00pm.



• Take place in an **accessible** building in Edinburgh.

Accessible means it is easy to use and suitable for people with different needs.



You will be paid £150 for each day.



You must be able to take part in both days.

Online workshops



The online workshops will take 2 half days.

16 October 2024

The first day will be on Wednesday 16 October 2024.




The second day will be on Wednesday 5 March 2025.



On both days the workshop will:

You will be paid £90 for each day.




You must be able to take part in both days.
